The Economics major requires a total of 61 to 64 units, which consists of:

Lower Division (17-20 units):

- Economics 1A and Economics 1B
- Statistics 13, 32 or 102
- Mathematics 16A/B, MAT 17A/B or MAT 21A/B

Upper Division (44 units):

- Intermediate Micro and Macro Theory courses (ECN 100 and 101)
- Analysis of Economic Data (ECN 102)
- One Economics History course (ECN 110A, 110B, 111A or 111B)
- Four Advanced Economics courses (after completing ECN 100 and 101)
- Three Elective Economics courses (choice of Advanced, Elective, or History courses)

Students must also complete requirements for the University and College in addition to the major and should consult:

Notes:

Lower Division = courses numbered 1 to 99

Upper Division = courses numbered 100 to 199

Recommendations for course planning:

- **Reduced course load in Fall (12-14 units recommended).**
It is advisable for students to take a slightly reduced course load during the first quarter at UCD, about 12-14 units, while adjusting to *a new campus, the quarter system, and other changes*. Students need to average 15 units per quarter in order to complete all requirements in four years (180 units total). In planning course loads after the first quarter students should also consider outside responsibilities and commitments.
- ***Minimum Progress Requirement***
Please note the College of Letters and Science has a minimum progress requirement which states students must complete 39 units at the end of 3 quarters to be in good academic standing. <http://advising.ucdavis.edu/>
- **Start Math first!**
The Economics Department recommends students begin their mathematics series, foreign language and English requirement as soon as possible. If a student is considering graduate study in Economics, MAT 21A, 21B, 21C and 22A are strongly recommended. Students could begin either Economics 1A or 1B in the following quarters.
- **Do not take more than 2 ECN courses at a time!**
The Economics Department does not recommend taking more than 2 Economics courses at a time.

The attached “Sample 4-Year Academic Plan” is simply a suggestion but there are many variations. This packet also includes a sample for students needing University Writing Program (UWP) 22, 23 (formerly Linguistics [LIN] 22 and 23) or Workload 57.
